

EMPLOYMENT TRIBUNALS (England and Wales)

CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER OF THE PRESIDENT

In the matter of: Claims against Flybe Limited ("Flybe") and WFS Airport Solutions Limited ("WFS") arising out of their entering Administration on 5 and 12 March 2020 respectively

CLAIMS against Flybe and WFS (arising out of their entering Administration) having been received in various Employment Tribunal regions in England and Wales, and those claims being variously presented by or on behalf of individual claimants as well as on behalf of the British Airline Pilots Association (BALPA)

AND having considered correspondence from the parties

AND having regard to the overriding objective under rule 2 of the first schedule to the Employment Tribunals (Constitution and Rules of Procedure) Regulations 2013

AND having regard to the distribution of judicial and administrative workload and resources as between the Employment Tribunal regions

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. All such present and future claims against **Flybe** be transferred to the South West England Employment Tribunal region;
- 2. All such claims are to be combined and case managed in accordance with the directions of the Regional Employment Judge for the South West England region, with a view to any claims being heard at the Employment Tribunal in Bristol; and
- 3. A preliminary hearing for the purposes of case management shall be listed remotely at Bristol as soon as possible after 3 August 2020.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

4. All such present and future claims against **WFS** be transferred to the Midlands (West) Employment Tribunal region;

- 5. All such claims are to be combined and case managed in accordance with the directions of the Regional Employment Judge for the Midlands (West) region, with a view to any claims being heard at the Employment Tribunal in Birmingham; and
- 6. A preliminary hearing for the purposes of case management shall be listed remotely at Birmingham as soon as possible after 3 August 2020.

FURTHER APPLICATIONS

- 7. Any party or representative wishing to make representations for the future conduct of any such claims should do so upon application to the Regional Employment Judge for the relevant region (South West England or Midlands (West) as appropriate) and copied to any other interested party or person.
