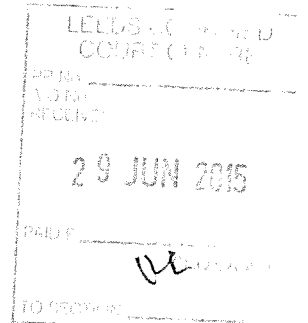

LEEDS CITY COUNCIL -v- MANNION

SENTENCE

DISTRICT JUDGE HESFORD: Mr Mannion, please stand up. This is the third occasion

you have been before the Court in relation to this injunction. On one occasion you have admitted that you were in breach, on another occasion you are disputing that, and this matter is listed for hearing on the 26th of this month. I have in front of me a witness statement which you filed which says that you are fully aware that it is not sensible, and you do accept and understand the seriousness of the injunction. Whilst that may be true at the time it was taken to sign, clearly it has either slipped your memory or it is something which you have chosen to ignore.

I accept you have very considerable health problems, and I accept that you are unwell here today. However, as I have already pointed out, there are several aggravating factors in relation to this matter. The police were called; you were found at the house knowing full well you were not supposed to be there.

The Hearing which is on 26th of June next week is in relation to the two earlier breaches. Insofar as the breach today is concerned, my sentence is that you will receive a custodial sentence of 14 days, and that will be suspended. Now the reason for that is that the penalties open to me range -

accepting that this is a case where there may be not necessarily harassment, alarm or distress, but there is a lesser degree of that with an accusation by your partner of violence, but in any event that would be a maximum of six weeks custody. I am satisfied that it is entirely appropriate that there should be a custodial sentence but I am going to suspend that for a period of....

MR TONG: Well, if that ran alongside the length of the injunction?

DISTRICT JUDGE HESFORD: Until December, I think?

MR TONG: Yes.

DISTRICT JUDGE HESFORD: So it will be a sentence of 14 days, suspended until the injunction expires which I believe is 1st December? Could you correct me if that is wrong?

1 MR TONG: That is correct, Ma'am.  
2 DISTRICT JUDGE HESFORD: So 14 days suspended until 1st December 2015.  
3 Mr Mannion, if you breach the injunction again – and I am not taking into account the two  
4 previous breaches; that would be a matter for the Judge next week – if you breach the injunction  
5 again there is a suspended sentence hanging over you. I appreciate that with the best intentions in  
6 the world you wish to look after your partner. You cannot do that at that property. I am entirely  
7 satisfied as a fact that section 1, paragraph 1(a) of the injunction was breached in the early hours of  
8 this morning, and in the circumstances that is my sentence. Thank you.
