	I am, Christopher Murray Assistant coroner, for the coroner area of South Manchester
2	CORONER'S LEGAL POWERS
	I make this report under paragraph 7, Schedule 5, of the Coroners and Justice Act 2009 and regulations 28 and 29 of the Coroners (Investigations) Regulations 2013
3	INVESTIGATION and INQUEST
	On 4 th July 2016 I commenced an investigation into the death of Roseleen Mary O'DONOGHUE. The investigation concluded on the 23 rd November 2016 and the conclusion was one of Accidental Death. The medical cause of death was 1a) Traumatic scalp laceration and subdural haemorrhage.
4	CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DEATH
	Mrs O'Donoghue fell down her stairs at home on the 26 th or 27 th June 2016 which resulted in a traumatic fatal head injury sustained in the impact following the fall and she was pronounced dead at the scene on 27 th June 2016.
5	CORONER'S CONCERNS
	During the course of the inquest the evidence revealed matters giving rise to concern. In my opinion there is a risk that future deaths will occur unless action is taken. In the circumstances it is my statutory duty to report to you.
	The MATTERS OF CONCERN are as follows. — The stair lift fitted at 7 Radnor St does not come to rest in the safest possible position when at the top of its journey giving rise to a risk of falling, as the step plate is suspended over the stair well. I am concerned you may have other properties featuring the same type of risk.
6	ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN
	In my opinion action should be taken to prevent future deaths and I believe you have the power to take such action.
7	YOUR RESPONSE
	You are under a duty to respond to this report within 56 days of the date of this report, namely by 28 th February 2017. I, the coroner, may extend the period.
	Your response must contain details of action taken or proposed to be taken, setting out the timetable for action. Otherwise you must explain why no action is proposed.
