The investigation concluded at the end of the inquest on 27th November 2017 The medical cause of death was Ia Morphine toxicity Il Acute bronchopneumonia The conclusion of the inquest was Drug-related. CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DEATH 4 Mr. Berryman was found dead at his home address **CORONER'S CONCERNS** 5 During the course of the inquest the evidence revealed matters giving rise to concern. In my opinion there is a risk that future deaths will occur unless action is taken. In the circumstances it is my statutory duty to report to you. The MATTERS OF CONCERN are as follows. -In evidence it was established that Mr. Berryman was assessed by Wells Road Surgery on 28.4.17 in respect of a chest infection but 1. The clinical assessment took place in the waiting area, not a consultation room; No examination of the chest was performed; 2. No clinical record was made. **ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN** 6 In my opinion action should be taken to prevent future deaths and I believe you] have the power to take such action. YOUR RESPONSE You are under a duty to respond to this report within 56 days of the date of this report,

namely by 24th January 2018. I, the Coroner, may extend the period.

Your response must contain details of action taken or proposed to be taken, setting out the timetable for action. Otherwise you must explain why no action is proposed.
