On Tuesday 16th July 2019 this court committed JEROME SENGHORE to prison in relation to the order dated 15th April 2019 which provided that JEROME SENGHORE should not:

- 1. Enter Gunthorpe Street, London E1 and the area bounded by Commercial Street, Cannon Street, Cable Street, Leman Street, Alie Street or Goodman's Stile as shown marked red on the attached map. He was permitted to be on Commercial Street, Canon Street, Cable Street, Leman Street, Alie Street or Goodman's Stile.
- 2. Enter any residential block owned by the London Borough of Towwer Hamlest to loiter, beg for money or alms, take drugs or sleep.
- 3.
- 4. Be in possession of any illegal drugs or paraphernalia (including but not limited to cannabis) in any residential premises owned by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets
- 5. Engage in conduct causing or capable of causing nuisance and annoyance to any person in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets.

The Court found that JEROME SENGHORE (who did not attend the hearing despite having been given notice of it had breached the order by:

- 1. On 12th May 2019 he was in the archway of Gunthorpe Street and at midnight was outside Burger King on Whitechapel High Street yelling at another person.
- 2. On 19th May 2019 the Defendant was loitering at the top of Gunthorpe Street and a resident reported him as frequently loitering there.
- 3. On 20th May 2019 the Defendant was arrested by police in an electricity cupboard at Dowler House a residential block owned by the London borough of Tower Hamlets. He was in possession of a single bag of herbal cannabis.
- 4. On 3rd June 2019 the Defendant was on Whitechapel High Street calling 'ganja' and 'hashish'
- 5. On 5th June 2019 the Defendant was walking down Gunthorpe Street at 4pm in the afternoon.
- 6. On 8th June 2019 the Defendant was selling drugs in Gunthorpe Street at 4.40pm.

The Court imposed the following sentences 1 (one) year on each of the 6 breaches all to run concurrently.

Accordingly it was ordered that JEROME SENGHORE be committed for contempt to Her Majesty's Prison at Pentonville for a total period of 1 (one) year or until lawfully discharged if sooner and that a warrant of arrest and committal be issued forthwith.
