

**Pursuant to paragraph 13 of Practice Direction: Committal for Contempt of Court
– Open Court**

Case Number E00BM326 Birmingham City Council v D Taylor

In relation to the above numbered case on 3 October 2019, Her Honour Judge Wall, sitting as a Judge in the County Court at Birmingham Civil Justice Centre, sentenced the Defendant in that case, to a custodial sentence of 118 days for contempt of court on breach of an Injunction Order dated 9 November 2018. The basis of the sentence imposed is that Dean Taylor

Was in breach of the Injunction, by

1. On 7/9/19 Dean Taylor attended 36 Middlemore Road in breach of paragraph 4 of the Injunction dated 9/11/18

2. On 26/9/19 Dean Taylor attended 36 Middlemore Road in breach of paragraph 4 of the Injunction dated 9/11/18

3. On 13/5/18, 29/5/18, 3/6/18 Dean Taylor allowed visitors at the property in breach of Paragraph 3 of the injunction dated 20/4/18

1. 120 days

2. 120 days (To run concurrently)

3. 28 days suspended committal originally imposed 14/6/18 activated 3/10/19 for 14 days only, consecutively, less 16 days served on remand.

TOTAL SENTENCE 118 days imprisonment.

These breaches were contrary to the terms of the Injunction Order dated 9 November 2018 to which Dean Taylor was subject.
