1	<p><b>CORONER</b></p> <p>I am Mr. T. G. Moore, Assistant Coroner, for the Area of Avon</p>
2	<p><b>CORONER'S LEGAL POWERS</b></p> <p>I make this report under paragraph 7, Schedule 5, of the Coroners and Justice Act 2009 and regulations 28 and 29 of the Coroners (Investigations) Regulations 2013.</p>
3	<p><b>INVESTIGATION and INQUEST</b></p> <p>On 7<sup>th</sup> April 2015 an investigation commenced into the death of <b>Ben Clive HISCOX</b>, Aged 30. The investigation concluded at the end of the inquest on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2015.</p> <p>The conclusion was that the medical cause of death was 1a) Traumatic brain injury and the conclusion was that of an Accidental death.</p>
4	<p><b>CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DEATH</b></p> <p>Mr Hiscox came into contact with the clubhouse when he lost his footing during a passage of play in which he was running forward close to the touchline.</p>
5	<p><b><u>CORONER'S CONCERNS</u></b></p> <p>During the course of the inquest the evidence revealed matters giving rise to concern. In my opinion there is a risk that future deaths will occur unless action is taken. In the circumstances it is my statutory duty to report to you.</p> <p>The <b>MATTERS OF CONCERN</b> was the distance between the touchline and the clubhouse was less than the F. A. recommendation guidelines putting players at risk of death or injury.</p> <p>No action appears to have been taken on the day by the referee in respect of the above F. A. Guidelines</p>
6	<p><b>ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN</b></p> <p>In my opinion action should be taken to prevent future deaths and I believe you [AND/OR your organisation] have the power to take such action.</p>
7	<p><b>YOUR RESPONSE</b></p> <p>You are under a duty to respond to this report within 56 days of the date of this report, namely by <b>7<sup>th</sup> October 2015</b>. I, the Coroner, may extend the period.</p> <p>Your response must contain details of action taken or proposed to be taken, setting out the timetable for action. Otherwise you must explain why no action is proposed.</p>
8	<p><b>COPIES and PUBLICATION</b></p>

I have sent a copy of my report to the Chief Coroner and to the following Interested Persons – the family and Stoke Gifford Football Club.

I am also under a duty to send the Chief Coroner a copy of your response.
