C stated that he had made threats to kill her, her mother and the rest of her family. She stated that he had previously shown her a photograph of a gun. They parted company but G continued to call C to sort things out. It was recorded that no offences had been disclosed and no injuries had been sustained. It was decided that officers would issue G with a further harassment warning.

When they reached C's car, she got in and G held the door open.
