The process of reform : private law

In previous 'Views from the President's Chambers' I have said much about the ongoing reforms to public law. Some of what I have said applies equally to private law. But thus far I have said very little which is specific to private law, where reform is equally necessary.

The Private Law Working Group which I set up under the chairmanship of Mr Justice Cobb has now reported. Its Report recommends the replacement of the Private Law Programme with an entirely new Child Arrangements Programme. The Working Group has prepared further draft documents and also approved an expectation document prepared by Cafcass. I am grateful for the work done so quickly and so effectively by Stephen Cobb and his team and trust that it will receive the careful consideration which it deserves.

I am anxious to consult as widely as possible on these proposals. I shall welcome and value all comments from anyone with an involvement or interest in the family justice system.
